- ✓ Training is in sustainable horticulture or environmental stewardship
- ✓ A plan to share information with the Master Gardener Foundation, WSU or the local community is required to complete the application
- ✓ Training assistance is a one time monetary award.
- ✓ Applications are accepted anytime.
- ✓ Awards are subject to available funds
- ✓ Travel expenses, meals and motel expenses will not be funded.
